Recent DIGITALEUROPE EU Member's Investments



This year, Siemens celebrated two manufacturing investment milestones in the U.S.. In Fort Worth, Texas, the company opened its \$190 million electrical equipment manufacturing facility, where it is on track to add 800 roles by 2026. The 500,000-square-foot site is responsible for producing reliable and efficient electrical equipment, such as low-voltage switchboards, to meet the demand from the booming data centre market and America's Al growth. On the West Coast, Siemens' Pomona, California, legacy facility has completed a \$95 million expansion and upgrade.



Danfoss has made a bold leap forward in Tallahassee, Florida, unveiling a cutting-edge 145,000-square-foot manufacturing facility designed to meet surging global demand for its high-efficiency, oil-free compressors. This **\$62 million investment** has doubled the company's footprint and reinforced its commitment to sustainability and innovation.

The new factory is equipped to significantly increase compressor output—doubling production capacity—which is a crucial move as data centers, especially hyperscale facilities, become the fastest-growing market segment for Danfoss, driven by the accelerated adoption of Artificial Intelligence.



Siemens Healthineers is investing \$150 million in new projects to expand production, create jobs and better serve customers in the U.S., our largest market globally.

The new investments come on top of the \$900 million Siemens Healthineers spends on R&D in the U.S. annually and more than \$1 billion invested through facilities expansion, acquisitions and strategic partnerships in the U.S. since 2019.



Since 1992, the BMW Group has invested more than \$14.8 billion (through December 31, 2024), and the Spartanburg plant is currently in the middle of its seventh major expansion. This expansion was announced on October 19, 2022 – a \$1.7 billion investment to prepare the plant for the assembly of electric vehicles and to build a high-voltage battery assembly plant in Woodruff, SC.

There are more than 11,000 jobs onsite.
